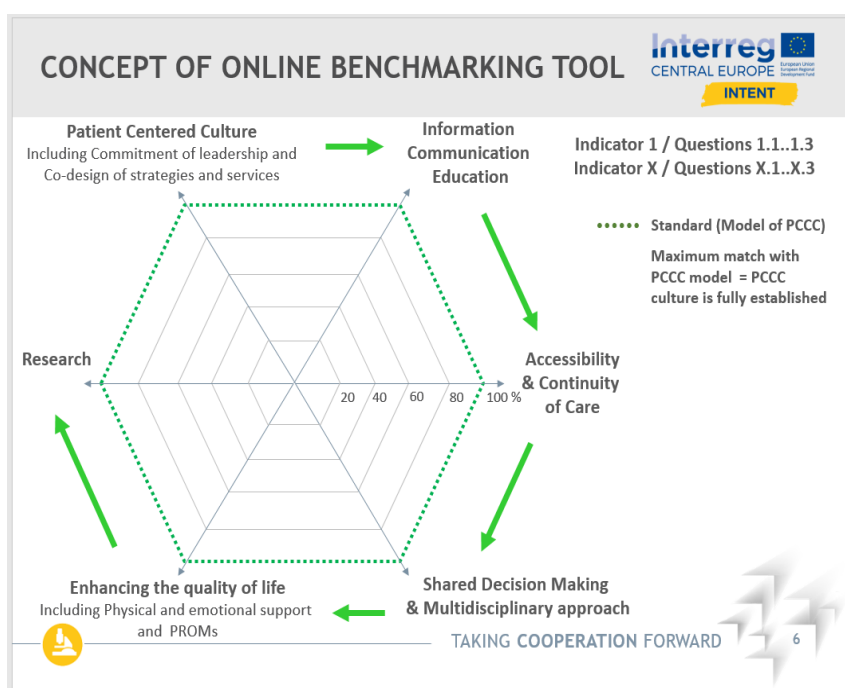




Radar Axis Chart Template
